The Creed *on Sundays and Major Feast Days.*

I believe in one God,

*All: the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
and of all things visible and invisible;*

And in one Lord Jesus Christ,

**the Only Begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds,
God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made,
being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made;
who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven,**

All bow: and was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary, and was made man;

And was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered and was buried;

and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures,

and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of the Father;

and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the quick and the dead;

whose kingdom shall have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the Giver of Life,

who proceedeth from the Father and the Son;

who with the Father and the Son

together is worshipped and glorified; who spake by the Prophets.

The Penitential Rite

Ye that do truly and earnestly repent ... *or:* Draw near with faith ...

Almighty God, *All: Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,*

maker of all things, judge of all men:

We acknowledge and bewail our manifold sins and wickedness,

which we from time to time most grievously have committed,

by thought, word, and deed, against thy divine Majesty,

provoking most justly thy wrath and indignation against us.

We do earnestly repent, and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings;

the remembrance of them is grievous unto us, the burden of them is intolerable.

Have mercy upon us, have mercy upon us, most merciful Father;

for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, forgive us all that is past;

and grant that we may ever hereafter serve and please thee in newness of life,

to the honour and glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Priest continues:

May Almighty God, our heavenly Father... through Jesus Christ our Lord. *All: Amen.*

The Liturgy of the Eucharist

Prayer over the Offerings

Blessed art thou, O Lord, God of all creation... become for us the bread of life.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Blessed art thou, O Lord, God of all creation... our spiritual drink.

All: Blessed be God for ever.

Pray, brethren... acceptable unto God, the Father almighty.

**All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at thy hands,
for the praise and glory of his Name,
for our good and the good of all his holy Church.**

*The priest continues with the Prayer over the Offerings from the Proper of the Day
which concludes: through Jesus Christ our Lord. All: Amen*

Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you.

All: And with thy spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Let us give thanks unto the Lord our God. **All: It is meet and right so to do.**

The Priest sings or says the Preface which concludes with the People saying aloud:

All: Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts:

Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord Most High.

✠ Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The People kneel. The Priest, with hands extended, continues the Eucharistic Prayer.

Memorial Acclamation B

The mystery of faith: *And the People continue, acclaiming:*

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup,

we proclaim thy Death, O Lord, until thou come again.

Then the Priest continues with the Eucharistic Prayer which concludes:

By whom and with whom and in whom, to thee... world without end. **All: Amen.**

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and taught us, we are bold to say,

**All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name,
thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.**

**Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us.**

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

The Priest continues: Deliver us, O Lord, we beseech thee... and safe from all distress.

All: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Peace

O Lord Jesus Christ, who saidst to thine Apostles...

...one God, world without end.

All: Amen.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And with thy spirit.

Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

All: Therefore let us keep the feast.

The Agnus Dei

O Lamb of God, **All: that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.**

O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, have mercy upon us.

O Lamb of God, that takest away the sins of the world, grant us thy peace.

Prayer of Humble Access

Then the Priest, with all who shall receive Communion, says:

All: We do not presume to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy Table. But thou art the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

The Priest takes the Host and, turning to the People, slightly raised above the Chalice, says:

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him that taketh away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb.

The People respond thrice:

All: Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldst come under my roof, but speak the word only, and my soul shall be healed.

The Prayer After Communion

All: Almighty and everliving God, we most heartily thank thee for that thou dost feed us, in these holy mysteries, with the spiritual food of the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ; and dost assure us thereby of thy favour and goodness towards us; and that we are very members incorporate in the mystical body of thy Son, the blessed company of all faithful people; and are also heirs, through hope, of thy everlasting kingdom, by the merits of the most precious death and passion of thy dear Son. And we humbly beseech thee, O heavenly Father, so to assist us with thy grace, that we may continue in that holy fellowship, and do all such good works as thou hast prepared for us to walk in; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with thee and the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, world without end. Amen.
